On March 8, FST organized a puppetry show, "Akou notun probhat hobo," performed by PuppetPeople Assam (NAAT Foundation), at City Centre Mall, Guwahati. The show used colourful puppets to tell empowering stories based on real-life incidents, highlighting the importance of gender equality and honouring women's contributions to society.







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In Hatigaon and Uzan Bazar, we brought together 73 women to celebrate International Women's Day on 7th March, 2025. The program featured:

- A thought-provoking movie screening of "Ghar ki Murgi," sparking meaningful discussions and reflections.
- A powerful awareness drama performed by the community people on sexual harassment in the workplace, emphasizing the importance of safe spaces for women.
- Sharing of inspiring stories by collective members showcasing their strength and resilience.







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On February 28, our young girls and boys in Khorichala Khoyarbagan, Barpeta, organized dramas that showcased their vision for an ideal school and life. The performances were a testament to their creativity and commitment to creating positive change. Highlights included:

- Awareness plays on child marriage and menstrual health and hygiene performed by the young leaders.
- Innovative model of ideal school presented by young minds.
- Shared powerful stories of change by the community leaders.










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On March 24, 2025, we held a workshop on enhancing digital literacy for residents of the Uzan Bazar area. Inspector Arbil Hojai from the Panbazar Cyber Crime Cell provided essential insights regarding the significance of digital literacy, the consequences of cybercrime, and various online scams, such as digital arrest, parcel scams, Over the Phone (OTP) fraud, and others. He also educated the attendees on legal recourse to combat scams and distributed helpline numbers for assistance. Around 20 individuals participated in the workshop, and attendees shared their own experiences with online difficulties.

We recently conducted a three-day skill-building training on tailoring for the women's collectives of the Uzan Bazar and Hatigaon areas at the Usha Anupa Training Centre, Bamunimaidam, Guwahati, from 9th to 11th April. A total of 16 enthusiastic individuals from these areas participated in the training session. Our resource person, Shantana Sharma, covered topics including:

- Basic blouse cutting
- Kurta cutting
- Basic stitching methods

The participants showed great interest in learning and expressed their desire to use this skill to earn money. Some participants even attempted to stitch blouses and kurtas with guidance, demonstrating their eagerness to develop their skills.









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
Skill-building session on food hygiene and sanitation measures

Story of change



Meet Manjuwara, a young married woman from Bolaipathar village, Barpeta, who defied societal norms and family expectations to reclaim her right to education. Married at 15 and a mother at 16, Manjuwara's dreams of pursuing her studies seemed lost forever. However, her life took a transformative turn when she began attending FST meetings under the Young Girls Education and Empowerment project.

Through these meetings, Manjuwara discovered the power of education and its impact on her life. She learned about essential topics like menstruation, good touch, and bad touch, but it was importance of education that resonated with her the most. Manjuwara shared, "I thought my life was over, and I wouldn't be able to start it again." But attending **FST** meetings gave her new purpose.

Determined to pursue her dreams, Manjuwara decided to enroll in Class 9 again in this year, despite her husband's initial disapproval and societal pressure. She faced many barriers, but her resolve remained unshaken. Now, she and her daughter both of them attends school together.

As she prepares to take her Class 9th exam, she says, "Education is not just a right, but a key to unlocking a brighter future."

Her journey serves as a powerful reminder that it's never too late to start a new and that education can transform lives.
